Transport and access

Emergency building evacuation procedures

SAB is fitted with an emergency evacuation system as follow:

Alert alarm (beep...BEEP....)

- -Prepare to evacuate
- —Turn off equipment
- Evacuate if there is immediate danger

Evacuate alarm (whoop...WHOOP...)

- Evacuate the building
- Follow the exit signs
- Do not use lifts or escalators (unless directed to do so by wardens)
- Exit the building
- Proceed to the assembly area (refer Evacuation diagrams in corridors)

Move

- Move people from danger to safety if safe to do so
- Activate

- Close the door- if safe to do so

Ring

-Ring Fire Brigade (0-000) or Security (Ext. 53333)

Attack

- Attack fire- if safe to do so

Evacuate

- Evacuate to a safe assembly area until emergency is over.
